Riverwood a Top 20 Critical Access Hospital...again!



For the second year in a row, Riverwood Healthcare Center in Aitkin, Minn., has been named one of the Top 20 Critical Access Hospitals (CAHs) in the United States!

The Top 20 Critical Access Hospitals, including Riverwood, scored best among critical access hospitals nationwide as determined by The Chartis Center for Rural Health. The rankings were recently announced by the National Rural Health Association (NRHA).

"We were excited to learn that Riverwood is the only critical access hospital in Minnesota to achieve this prestigious national recognition," said Cindi Baker, Riverwood's interim chief executive officer. "We are extremely proud of our physicians, physician assistants, nurse practitioners, nurses and every single member of our team, all of whom contribute to a culture of caring at Riverwood. The index shows that our hospital scores very high on two key factors in health care--quality of care and patient satisfaction."

The Top 20 Critical Access Hospital "winners" are those hospitals that have achieved success in the overall performance based on a composite rating from eight indices of strength: quality, outcomes, patient perspectives, charge and financial stability, inpatient market share, and outpatient market share. This group was selected from The Chartis Center for Rural Health's 2018 Top 100 Critical Access Hospitals list, which was released earlier this year. Riverwood made the Top 100 list for the fifth time in 2018.







Introducing 3D mammography in Aitkin

The five-year survival rate is close to 100 percent when breast cancer is caught early. Riverwood recently began providing 3D mammography™ exams at its Aitkin facility, which supports early breast cancer detection.

"We are thrilled to provide 3D mammography to our community," said Jan Hegman, nurse practitioner and oncology care coordinator at Riverwood. "It can help detect cancer earlier because it offers multiple images of breast tissue for greater clarity and accuracy. There's also a benefit to women with dense breast tissue, which can cause shadows due to overlapping tissue and hide tumors from traditional 2D mammography."

What is 3D mammography?

Three dimensional or 3D mammography, also known as digital breast tomosynthesis, is a revolutionary new screening and diagnostic breast imaging tool to improve the early detection of breast cancer. Approved as an imaging modality by the FDA in early 2011, 3D mammography is used in combination with 2D digital mammography.

What are the benefits of 3D mammography?

3D mammography finds 20-65 percent more invasive cancers than conventional mammography alone, an average increase of 41 percent. It reduces unnecessary callbacks for suspicious findings that prompt more testing by about 40 percent.

How can you schedule a 3D mammogram?


Riverwood's Garrison and McGregor clinics continue to offer conventional 2D mammography, which takes two-dimensional pictures of the breast and is still one of the most advanced tools available for detecting breast abnormalities.

"Women age 40 and older should have an annual mammogram, whether it's 2D or 3D," Hegman said. "Some women should be screened earlier due to family history and other risk factors. Ask your provider about the screening schedule recommended for you."



Reflux & Heartburn Solutions

Success Story: Procedure halts reflux symptoms

Attending a Riverwood seminar on solutions for reflux and heartburn put **Dawn Britney Shockency** of Coleraine on the road to recovery from gastro-esophageal reflux disease.

"I had been struggling with worsening acid reflux symptoms for the past three to four years," Dawn explains. "I was having a lot of acid reflux at night. It got to the point where I could hardly eat at all and I felt nauseous all the time."

After attending the March 2017 seminar, Dawn decided to see if they could help her at the Minnesota Reflux and Heartburn Center at Riverwood Healthcare Center in Aitkin—the town where she grew up and graduated from high school.

An EGD exam, which offers a view of the inside of the upper digestive tract, revealed that in addition to a hiatal hernia, Dawn had ulcers in her esophagus. A special medication was prescribed that cleared up the ulcers in about a month.

The MRHC reflux specialist who examined and treated Dawn recommended that she have a Nissen fundoplication procedure to treat her severe acid reflux disease in December 2017.

"At age 79, I was worried that I was too old to have this surgery," Dawn adds. "But my decision to go for it was the best decision in my whole life! I have no heartburn and I can eat pizza and spaghetti again. I haven't felt this good in ages."

Dawn appreciates all the clinic and hospital caregivers at Riverwood and some of the extra special services for patients.

Riverwood receives grant for opioid abuse prevention program

Riverwood Healthcare Center is one of eight Minnesota communities selected for grants totaling \$700,000 from the Minnesota Department of Health for an Opioid Abuse Community Prevention Pilot Project. In April, Riverwood received a two-year grant for \$100,000 to launch this project.



Dr. Mark Heggem, chief medical officer, has been leading Riverwood's efforts to evaluate and reduce opioid prescription drug use and abuse with the implementation of an opioid program.

Together we will.

"Riverwood will be working closely with Dr. Kurt Devine and his team at CHI St. Gabriel's Health in Little Falls to mirror their successful and nationally recognized opioid reduction strategy," explains Dr. Heggem. "This includes the formation of an internal controlled substance care team that has already been meeting. I'm pleased to report that in just six months we have seen a 20 percent reduction in the prescribing and use of opioid medications among Riverwood patients."

Some of the key goals of the opioid abuse prevention program are to:

- Reduce emergency room and other health care provider visits resulting from opioid use or abuse, as well as reduce rates of drug overdoses/ deaths in the community
- Establish a multidisciplinary controlled substance care team that consists of physicians, pharmacists, social workers, nurse care coordinators, and mental health professionals
- Reduce the inappropriate use of opioids by patients and rates of opioid addiction
- Reduce the inappropriate prescribing and dispensing of opioids

Riverwood will hire a Registered Nurse Care Coordinator to assist with the opioid abuse prevention program. In addition, a county-wide task force for Aitkin County, including law enforcement, school districts, Aitkin County Health and Human Services, pharmacies and others, will be created to help address this important issue.
