Proven treatment for overactive bladder



Minnesota Center for Obstetrics and Gynecology: Dr. Rachel Cady and Dr. Michael Cady

As we age, the nerves and muscles that control the bladder may not work as well as we want, causing leakage.

In some patients, bladder control problems are caused by miscommunication between nerves. More specifically, the brain and sacral nerves, which control the bladder, do not communicate properly, causing the nerves to tell the bladder when to release urine at the wrong time. Pregnancy and childbirth, obesity, weak pelvic muscles, diabetes, bladder cancer or stones and neurological disorders can contribute to overactive bladder.

Fortunately, there is a proven treatment option for women who have not had success with other overactive bladder treatment options, such as medications and behavioral therapy.

Drs. Michael and **Rachel Cady**, obstetrics and gynecology specialists with the Minnesota Center for Obstetrics & Gynecology, are among only a few surgeons locally offering a new high-tech solution to help women regain bladder control. They can implant a nerve-stimulating device called InterStim, which stimulates and quiets the nerves of the bladder.

The InterStim procedure has several benefits, including freedom from the embarrassment of leaks. It may also help reduce the need to interrupt sleep due to waking many times during the night to urinate.

"Patients who have had this procedure have used the term lifechanging," Dr. Michael Cady says. "It allows them to need a toilet less often, have less urgency, and more control of their bladder."

One 42-year-old patient who recently received the implant at Riverwood Healthcare Center with Dr. Michael Cady has been "thrilled" with the improvement she's experienced.

"I was having to urinate every 15 to 20 minutes," says Paula Mitchell. "Sharing one bathroom with my husband and two girls was very difficult as I could not hold it. After I had the InterStim implant, I'm so relieved to have control over my bladder again and I would recommend this procedure to anyone. Dr. Cady explained everything so well and the support from the nursing staff at Riverwood and the device company was great."

Dr. Michael Cady adds: "Other patients have told me that the procedure has 'given them back their lives.' They can once again go

places and do things they've not been able to do for some time while no longer constantly searching for the nearest bathroom. Some are now pad-free for the first time in years."

Anyone who has a urinary problem should address the issue as soon as possible, according to Drs. Michael and Rachel Cady. There is very effective treatment for people with overactive bladder leakage (also known as urge incontinence) and for whom medications have failed to help.

FECAL INCONTINENCE

Fecal incontinence is the inability to control bowel movements, causing stool (feces) to leak unexpectedly from the rectum. Also called bowel incontinence, fecal incontinence ranges from an occasional leakage of stool while passing gas to a complete loss of bowel control.

The InterStim nerve-stimulating device may also be used to treat fecal incontinence. Talk with your doctor about your symptoms and how to proceed with evaluation and treatment of this condition.

Kidney program coming to Aitkin

Riverwood Healthcare Center and CentraCare Health, headquartered in St. Cloud, have signed a letter of intent to collaborate on a new dialysis facility to serve residents of Aitkin County and the surrounding area.

"The need for comprehensive kidney care, including a kidney dialysis facility closer to home, has emerged as a growing community health need in recent years," said Chad Cooper, Riverwood chief executive officer. "This partnership is a reflection of several years of ongoing conversation with CentraCare and a mutual commitment to provide access to high-quality kidney care as close to home as possible."

CENTRACARE Kidney Program The CentraCare Dialysis facility will provide outpatient renal dialysis services featuring the most state-of-the-art technologies and personalized patient comfort to serve local patients who need dialysis treatments. Patients will receive their hemodialysis treatments in a clinical environment that is cheerful and home-like. Preliminary discussions regarding the location and timeline of the future dialysis facility in Aitkin are currently underway.

"Access to local dialysis services allows patients with chronic and end-stage kidney disease to live longer and have an improved quality of life," said **CentraCare**Nephrologist Ben Parker, MD. Beginning in October 2016, Dr. Parker, board certified in both internal medicine and nephrology, will provide local nephrology outreach services on a routine basis at Riverwood's specialty clinic. He will also oversee the clinical direction of the new dialysis facility in Aitkin.

Riverwood taps local farmers for fresh food

As part of its ongoing commitment to wellness programming for improving health, Riverwood will begin participating in a Farm2Riverwood program in September. Riverwood, along with Rippleside Elementary School and Hill City School District, is contracting with eight Aitkin County farmers to offer nutrient-dense, minimally processed, farm fresh foods such as potatoes, eggs, chicken, beef and apples for special monthly meals for its staff and hospital patients for the 2016-2017 year. This program is made possible through Healthy Northland (Statewide Health Improvement Program) and the Aitkin County Health & Human Services Public Health Unit.

"We are excited for the opportunity to partner with local farmers," said Cindi Hills, Riverwood human resources director, who served on the project committee. "Together, we will support the health, wellbeing, and growth of the communities we serve."

Kudos to Amy Wyant, Aitkin County health educator, for leading the development of this project.

Get routine foot care at Aitkin clinic

Do you have a hard time reaching your feet, trimming your nails or doing routine foot care? Riverwood now offers a Foot Care service in our Aitkin Outpatient clinic. Get your toenails clipped, nails filed and a foot massage by Jamie Lamke, a licensed practical nurse, at a cost of \$25 per visit. Insurance does not cover this service and payment is required at the time of check-in.

Joel's story: Pain-free active living with new hip joint



Joel Hyytinen, owner of Hyytinen Hardware Hank in Aitkin, had a hip replacement at Riverwood Healthcare Center with Dr. Erik Severson in January 2015. His story on his outstanding outcome is also posted at www.riverwoodhealthcare.org/foundation/stories.

"When my son was younger, I coached peewee hockey. In fact, I actually coached Dr. Erik Severson! I was a real sports guy, playing three sports most of my life.

Eventually though, because of my hip pain, I was unable to play anymore and I had to quit hockey. The pain got to the point where, when we were in the car, we'd have to stop every 20 minutes just so I could move around.

I first met with Dr. Severson to have x-rays in 2010, but it took five more years until I finally decided to have the surgery in January 2015. The whole process was amazing – from the time I committed until it was all done!

The pre-op education session was very helpful. Everyone who is going to have a joint replacement during the month comes together in a meeting to learn what will happen. It was really comforting to have a community that came out of that meeting. Now, many of us who had similar surgeries still connect.

From the second I came out of surgery, I had no pain. I did the exercises – even did extra exercises – but I never took any pain meds. I know I was lucky because it took others longer, but for me, it was incredible!

Now that I'm walking pain-free again, I got to go pheasant hunting for the first time in 15 years!"
