



Advanced Solutions for Reflux Disease

Many individuals have experienced occasional heartburn after eating a spicy pizza or a heavy meal. But when digestive discomfort becomes more frequent and a person is taking over-thecounter antacid medications several times a week, it's probably time to seek medical care.

Heartburn is the most common symptom of GERD. Others may include regurgitation, a chronic cough, hoarseness and chest pain. Each person's experience can be very different.



MRHC team offers high-touch, high-tech services

The cause of GERD is stomach acid backing into the esophagus due to a weakening of the lower esophageal sphincter, which is a muscular ring of muscles that opens to allow food to pass into the stomach. Over time, untreated reflux disease can create an abnormal lining called Barrett's esophagus, which can lead to cancer of the esophagus. This cancer is the fastest rising cancer in the United States, with over a 600 percent increase in the last three decades.

Today, over 30 percent of the U.S. population suffers to some degree with GERD and most are treated with over-the-counter or prescription proton pump inhibitor medications. However, studies show that about 7 million people are failing treatment on proton pump inhibitor medications and are dissatisfied with their treatment.

Established in 2015 at Riverwood Healthcare Center and Cuyuna Regional Medical Center, the Minnesota Reflux and Heartburn Center (MRHC) offers advanced solutions for those suffering from GERD. A staff of highly trained and experienced physicians specializing in reflux is assisted by nurses, dietitians and technicians for a team approach and smooth access to comprehensive treatment of GERD.

Dr. Paul Severson heads MRHC as medical director, practicing with Dr. Howard McCollister, Dr. Tim LeMieur, Dr. Shawn Roberts and Dr. Andrew Loveitt. This outstanding team of reflux specialists is dedicated to the treatment of GERD and related disorders using highly specialized treatments and the latest diagnostic equipment.

"In 2015, we began using a break-through technology called Cellvizio confocal laser endomicroscopy," said Dr. Paul Severson. "Cellvizio, the world's smallest microscope, generates optical biopsies, providing microscopic images of tissue instantly in a minimally invasive manner. This diagnostic tool offers improved patient management and detects Barrett's esophagus and cancer."

MRHC also offers other minimally invasive procedures, such as Nissen, Toupet and Collis-Nissen fundoplications, to treat GERD. These are surgical procedures in which the upper part of the stomach is wrapped around the lower end of the esophagus and stitched in place, reinforcing the closing function of the lower esophageal sphincter.

Patient-centered service

Contributing to outstanding patient satisfaction is a concierge-type service with a designated nurse coordinator to facilitate the entire process of GERD care. At Riverwood, the MRHC nurse coordinator is Dawn Harcey, RN. She follows each patient through the entire process of clinic appointments and testing.





"At Riverwood, you can expect to receive a comprehensive evaluation with a reflux specialist within one to two weeks," said Dawn Harcey. "I'm happy to do a phone or in-person consultation about testing and treatment information at no charge."



Leading-edge diagnostics for GERD

On the technology front, the use of Confocal Laser Endomicroscopy is one of the services that sets the Minnesota Reflux and Heartburn Center (MRHC) apart. Since the installation of Cellvizio, the world's smallest microscope, at both Riverwood and CRMC in 2015, reflux specialists are able to see what the tissue looks like at the cellular level allowing them to diagnose Barrett's esophagus and Esophageal cancer.



Endoflip supports early detection and treatment of gastrointestinal diseases and cancers.

Riverwood Therapy Services moves to front of facility

As part of its clinic expansion project in Aitkin, Riverwood Healthcare Center opened a new addition for **Therapy Services** in late October.

Riverwood's Aitkin facility has a new entrance to the right of the main hospital and clinic entrance. Patients and visitors will see a new sign, Therapy Services, as they enter.

"We are changing the name of our department from Rehabilitation to Therapy Services in coordination with the move timing," said Jill Sadlowsky, Therapy Services manager. "The new name is more inclusive of the wide range of therapy services we offer. Our therapy staff is thrilled to be moving into the larger space that will allow us to accommodate more patients, offer greater privacy, and expand some of our services such as pediatric care."

SOME OF THE KEY NEW PATIENT-FRIENDLY FEATURES OF THE THERAPY DEPARTMENT INCLUDE:

- Closer parking with less walking
- Drive-up convenience with closer drop-off/pick-up
- Easier access to therapy services through the clinic
- Larger gym space with pediatric equipment added
- More private treatment rooms
- Expanded space for speech and occupational therapy

Renovation will begin on the existing therapy area this fall to renovate the space for a new kidney care and dialysis center with nine patient bays for kidney dialysis, which will be operated by CentraCare Health and open in later 2019.
