

The Minnesota Reflux and Heartburn Center is a comprehensive, patient-centered initiative focused on providing a solution of testing and therapies for any and all patients with gastroesophageal reflux disease (GERD), heartburn, and esophageal symptoms.

The Center provides smooth access to comprehensive treatment of GERD as a service to patients and referring physicians. Various physician specialists treat advanced GERD on the same team with the goal of clinical excellence delivered in a manner that produces outstanding patient satisfaction.

All options of testing and treatment are available to patients. Patient education and participation in treatment decisions is paramount and the process is streamlined by eliminating long waits between appointments. Evaluation

If you think you have gastroesophageal reflux disease (GERD) and heartburn, take this quick self-assessment. If you answer YES to one or more of these questions, there is a good chance you may have GERD and heartburn requiring treatment.

- Do I get a burning feeling in the middle of my chest?
- Do I often have a burning feeling after a meal or at night?
- Does this burning feeling get worse when I lie down or bend over?
- Do over-the-counter medicines, such as acid reducers or antacids, help the burning go away?
- Do I frequently regurgitate (burp up) my food?
- Is there a bitter or sour taste in the back of my throat?

Thorough evaluations performed at the Minnesota Reflux and Heartburn Center help GERD and heartburn sufferers understand their treatment options. We provide a visual, microscopic, physiologic and functional evaluation of GERD and the esophagus.

Diagnostics

Given how common reflux and heartburn are, many patients are initially diagnosed and treated based solely on their history of symptoms. Many patients are already on an over-the-counter medication before they seek medical attention. If the reflux is mild enough that it completely resolves with over-the-counter medications, often no further work up is pursued. However, it is important to remember that although the symptoms are treated with medications, the actual reflux of stomach contents never stops, meaning that damage to the esophagus could be happening silently.
